#### A MYSTERY BENEATH THE YUCATÁN

For decades, scientists knew an asteroid had struck Earth.

The question was...

##### WHERE?

The crater should have been enormous. Yet no one could find it.

Unlike Arizona's Meteor Crater, Chicxulub had been buried beneath nearly a kilometer of limestone deposited over the next 66 million years.

It had effectively disappeared.

Or so everyone thought.



#### THE FIRST CLUE

##### GLEN PENFIELD'S GRAVITY MAPS

In the late 1970s, geophysicist Glen Penfield, working with Mexico's national oil company (PEMEX), noticed something unusual.

Gravity surveys revealed a nearly perfect circular anomaly beneath the northern Yucatán Peninsula.

##### DIAMETER:

Approximately  
**120 MILES (190 KM)**

Far too large to be volcanic.  
Far too symmetrical to ignore.

#### WHY OIL COMPANIES FOUND IT FIRST

PEMEX wasn't searching for dinosaurs. They were searching for oil.

To locate underground rock formations, they conducted...

- Gravity surveys
- Magnetic surveys
- Seismic reflection studies

Those same tools unexpectedly revealed one of Earth's largest impact structures.

Sometimes solving one problem answers another.



#### THE RING OF CENOTES

The Yucatán Peninsula contains hundreds of natural sinkholes called cenotes.

When mapped...

Many form an enormous arc.

That arc closely follows the buried outer rim of the Chicxulub crater.

Nature quietly outlined the impact for millions of years. Scientists simply had to notice.



#### ENGINEERING PERSPECTIVE

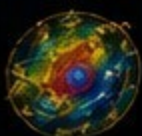
As an engineer, this story fascinates me because it demonstrates the power of indirect evidence. No one could see the crater. Instead, scientists combined multiple independent datasets.

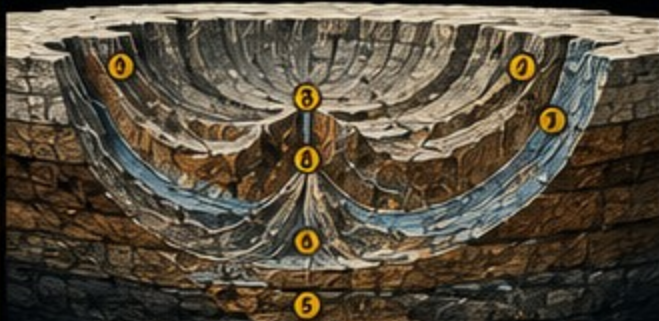

## ANATOMY OF A GIANT CRATER



- 1 Limestone Cover (~1 km thick)
- 2 Peak Ring
- 3 Melt Sheet
- 4 Brecciated Impact Rock
- 5 Central Uplift
- 6 Fractured Crust
- 7 Basement Rock

- Original crater depth approached 20 km (12 miles).
- The crater later collapsed into a broad multi-ring basin.
- Diameter approximately 190 km (120 miles).

## LOCATION MAP



The impact occurred in shallow tropical seas just offshore of what is now the northern Yucatán Peninsula, Mexico.

## THE PEAK RING

Perhaps the most astonishing discovery came decades later. Drilling deep into the crater recovered rocks that had once been buried more than six miles (10 km) beneath Earth's surface.

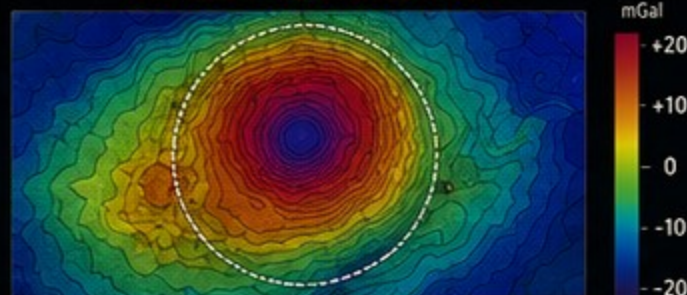
The impact had literally lifted deep crustal rocks upward before the crater collapsed.

No normal geological process could accomplish this on such a scale.

## GRAVITY ANOMALY MAP



The nearly perfect circular anomaly was the first unmistakable signature of a giant impact structure.

## SCIENTIFIC EVIDENCE

Evidence from multiple independent lines of research confirms Chicxulub as one of Earth's best-documented impact structures.

## IODP EXPEDITION 364 (2016)

The International Ocean Discovery Program scientifically drilled the peak ring.

Results confirmed:

- Impact melt rocks
- Shocked quartz
- Supracrustal rocks from >6 miles deep
- Radiometric age of ~66 million years
